

INTERDISTRICT
TRANSFERS

Eligibility for open enrollment transfers will be based on the following circumstances:

1. Residence in one of the following areas:

Area 1 is defined as parts of the cities of Coppell and Valley Ranch, west of the Carrollton-Farmers Branch ISD boundaries, south of Highway 121, east of Denton Tap/Beltline Road North, and north of I-635.

Students residing in Area 1 and entering grades K-8 in the fall of 2017 may make an open enrollment transfer application to attend Riverchase Elementary or Bush Middle School.

Expanded Area 1 (Secondary Schools Only)

Expanded Area 1 is defined as the city of Coppell and Valley Ranch, west of I35E and the C-FB ISD boundaries, south and east of Highway 121, and north of Interstate 635.

Students in grades 6 through 11 residing in Area 1 or Expanded Area 1 may apply for an open enrollment transfer to attend Barbara Bush Middle School or Ranchview High School.

Area 2 is defined as the City of Farmers Branch outside of the boundaries of the Carrollton-Farmers Branch ISD.

Students residing in Area 2 and entering grades K-8 in the fall of 2017 may make an open enrollment transfer application to attend Stark Elementary School or Field Middle School.

Expanded Area 2 (Secondary Schools Only)

Area 2 Expanded is defined as the city of Farmers Branch outside of the boundaries of the Carrollton-Farmers Branch ISD and parts of the cities of Addison and Dallas. District boundaries and Beltline Road are the northern boundaries; the Dallas North Tollway is the eastern boundary; CFB district lines are the western boundaries, and I-635 is the southern boundary.

Students residing in Area 2 or Expanded Area 2 in grades 6 through 11 in the fall of 2017 may apply for an open enrollment transfer to Field Middle School, Long Middle School, Polk Middle School, Turner High School, or Smith High School.

Area 3 is defined as part of the city of Irving, south and west of the Carrollton-Farmers Branch ISD boundaries, north of Northgate Drive West and south of Highway 635, east of Beltline Road North, and west of MacArthur Blvd. North.

Students residing in Area 3 and entering grades K-8 in the fall of 2017 may make an open enrollment transfer application to attend Las Colinas Elementary or Bush Middle School.

Expanded Area 3 (Secondary Schools Only)

Expanded Area 3 is defined as the city of Irving south of I-635 and the District lines; the western boundary is N. Beltline Road to Valley View Road, then Valley View to Northgate Drive; the southern boundary is Northgate Drive, and the eastern boundary is I-35E and Loop 12.

Students in grades 6 through 11 residing in Area 3 and Expanded Area 3 may apply for an open enrollment transfer to Barbara Bush Middle School or Ranchview High School.

Area 4 is defined as part of the city of Irving, south of the Carrollton-Farmers Branch ISD boundaries, west of Riverside Drive, and north of Northwest Highway.

Students residing in Area 4 and entering grades K-11 in the fall of 2017 may make an open enrollment transfer application to attend La Villita Elementary, Bush Middle School or Ranchview High School.

Area 5 (Secondary Schools Only) is defined as the cities of Carrollton and Lewisville to the north and west of District boundaries, extending to Highway 121 and I35E on the western side of Josey Lane. On the eastern side of Josey Lane, the northern boundary is Windhaven Parkway, and the eastern boundary is the Dallas North Toll Road. The southern boundary will be Beltline Road on the east side of the district. This change will add parts of Addison, Lewisville, Plano, and Dallas.

Students in grades 6 through 11 residing in this area may apply for an open enrollment transfer to Blalack Middle School, Long Middle School, Creekview High School, or Smith High School.

2. All applications for open enrollment are required to meet the following standards. The student must:
 - a. Offer proof of 90% attendance for the previous semester and the most recent six or nine week grading period.
 - b. Pass all classes in the previous semester and the most recent six or nine week grading period.
 - c. Pass all portions of his or her latest state test/assessment exam. Students from home school, private school or non-accredited school must show satisfactory achievement on district approved assessments.
 - d. Have a record that shows no disciplinary infractions that resulted in a mandatory placement in the Disciplinary Alternative Education Program (DAEP) or any placement at the Juvenile Justice Alternative Education Program (JJAEP) during the current and prior school years.
3. All open enrollment transfers are approved for a period of one school year, and students accepted under the open enrollment policy must reapply annually.
4. Students will be approved for admission based on space, availability of building capacity, grade level staffing limitations, a lottery process, and upon meeting all required criteria.
5. Application is by student and not by family. There is no guarantee that siblings will be approved to attend Carrollton-Farmers Branch ISD through the open enrollment process.
6. Elementary age siblings of secondary students applying for transfer in open enrollment expanded areas may be considered for transfer according to the regulations governing transfer and considering space availability.
7. Students accepted to an open enrollment campus may not apply for transfer to another District campus.
8. Students accepted to an open enrollment campus may be eligible for programs at other campuses based on academic needs of the students, based on space and availability of building capacity.
9. Students attending CFBISD under an open enrollment transfer must provide their own transportation to and from school.

REASONS FOR
REVOCATION

1. Repeated failure to abide by the rules specified in the C-FB Student Code of Conduct.
2. Student commits a disciplinary infraction that mandates removal to the DAEP or JJAEP.
3. Documented pattern of late arrivals, late pick-ups and/or poor attendance.
4. Falsification of information.
5. Failure to meet the enrollment criteria annually.
6. Relocation out of the open enrollment attendance zone.

OTHER

Students charged with a felony offense are not eligible for a transfer regardless of whether the alleged offense occurred on or off school property.
